

20 HERITAGE ASSETS

The Gables

The historical farmstead of The Gables, which dates to 17th century, lies nearby to the site and the site forms part of its setting. The special interest of the Grade II Listed The Gables derives from its historical fabric and architectural style, and this will not be altered by the development.



The Gables

The change in land use within the site (from arable land to residential) would change part of the surroundings of the building, however, the relationship between The Gables and its surrounding historical landscape will remain appreciable.

Archaeology

There are no overriding archaeological or heritage constraints identified that could preclude development of the site.

Bramford Church

The key elements of the church's physical surrounds comprise its cemetery that it sits within, its proximity to the River Gipping and location in Bramford as the settlement's parish church.

The application site makes no discernible contribution to the physical surrounds of the church.

It is anticipated that no harm will be afforded to the heritage significance of the Church of St Mary the Virgin as no elements key to the setting or heritage significance of the building will be altered.
